- Governor Brown's Drought Executive Order: April 1, 2015
- Public draft of revised MWELO: June 12
- Public meetings June 16, 19
- Public comment accepted until June 26
- Second draft released July 9
- Approval from California Water Commission: July 15
- File with Office of Administrative Law (current)
- Local adoptions due by December 1, 2015
- Reporting filings due by Dec. 31 (Jan 31 thereafter)
- Regional ordinances adoption due by February 1, 2016

ANNUAL REPORTING REQUIREMENTS

- § 495. Reporting. (a) Local agencies responsible for administering the ordinance shall report on implementation and enforcement by December 31, 2015. Subsequently, reporting will be due by January 31st of each year.
- Entity responsible for implementing
- Number, types of projects + total area
- Describe review procedures, verification actions, enforcement measures
- Explain challenges and educational needs to properly apply the ordinance

PRESCRIPTIVE COMPLIANCE OPTION

- 2015 WELO includes Appendix D
- Valuable where water budgets are not typical
- More likely to be verified and inspected
- Similar to rating system checklists
