
For the general public



- 1,600 sqft house in Unincorporated Menlo Park
- Built in 1947







- 17 people signed up
- 11 people attended
- 6 women and 5 men
- 3 men from Vocational Rehabilitation Services
- 8 of them heard about it from Nextdoor
- 5 people got certified











4,160 pounds sold the next day for \$1,800





Incentives and Changes to Building Regulations

Deconstruction survey

- Single family residential dwelling units required to obtain a demolition permit
- Complete a deconstruction survey provided by an approved third party
 - The ReUse People, PlaceMakers Inc., and Whole House Building Supply
- The survey shall include a list of materials that are reusable in the project
- Free to customer
- Deconstruction is not required

Incentives and Changes to Building Regulations

Add Waste Management Plans to renovations with a building permit fee of \$2,145 (\$50,000) or over

- We used to have \$250,000 or over and removed it
- Below are cities in SMC that have similar requirements:
 - Half Moon Bay \$5,000
 - Woodside \$10,000
 - Daly City \$25,000
 - Atherton, Burlingame, Redwood City, San Carlos, San Mateo, and South San Francisco \$50,000
 - Brisbane \$75,000
 - Portola Valley \$200,000

Incentives and Changes to Building Regulations

Work with the Planning Department to educate sooner

Allow deconstruction without erosion control



Salvage Center

- Released a RFP in July to develop and operate a Salvage Center to donate and purchase salvaged building materials
- Awarded contract up to \$300,000 to PlaceMakers Inc. on 1/7/20
- Partnering with The ReUse People to provide tax deduction receipts
- Improvements
 - Expanding 5,000 sqft
 - New lumber racks, cantilever racks, and forklift
 - 3 new shipping containers for materials
 - Will be open at least 5 days a week including Saturdays except major holidays within 6 months
 - Hope to have the ribbon cutting in March!
