Subject: Quarterly Disbursement of Measure D Revenues July - Sept., 2011

Dear City Manager:

The Alameda County Waste Reduction and Recycling Initiative (Measure D), levies a surcharge on solid waste landfilled in unincorporated Alameda County. Fifty percent of Recycling Fund revenues are disbursed to cities and sanitary districts that meet criteria contained in the law. Funds disbursed to municipalities must be used "...for the continuation and expansion of municipal recycling programs."

Enclosed with the copy sent to your staff Technical Advisory Committee (TAC) representative or designee please find the quarterly Measure D disbursement for your jurisdiction, covering the period July - September 2011.

I would particularly call your attention to the following:

1. The NewPoint Group, the independent auditors contracted to review all revenues and expenditures of Recycling Fund monies and compliance with the terms of the County Charter, are beginning their review of FY 09/10 and FY 10/11. They will be contacting the staff person listed on your most recent Measure D Annual Report submittal to arrange a time to visit your offices and review your records. The cooperation of member agency staff in completing this review in a timely manner is appreciated.
