## NOTES:

- A Solid Waste Enterprise that collects waste which originates in Alameda County and deposits that waste at a
  landfill or permitted waste facility in Alameda County is not required to fill out this form. Form 2009-01(a) must
  be filled out by a Solid Waste Enterprise that handles waste originating in Alameda County which is subsequently
  deposited in a landfill outside of Alameda County.
- 2. Solid Waste defined: California Public Resource Code Section 40191.
  - (a) Except as provided in subdivision (b), "solid waste" means all putrescible and nonputrescible solid, semisolid, and liquid wastes, including garbage, trash, refuse, paper, rubbish, ashes, industrial wastes, demolition and construction wastes, abandoned vehicles and parts thereof, discarded home and industrial appliances, dewatered, treated, or chemically fixed sewage sludge which is not hazardous waste, manure, vegetable or animal solid and semisolid wastes, and other discarded solid and semisolid wastes.
  - (b) "Solid waste" does not include any of the following wastes:
    - (1) Hazardous waste, as defined in Section 40141.
    - (2) Radioactive waste regulated pursuant to the Radiation Control Law (Chapter 8 (commencing with Section 114960) of Part 9 of Division 104 of the Health and Safety Code).
    - (3) Medical waste regulated pursuant to the Medical Waste Management Act (Part 14 (commencing with Section 117600) of Division 104 of the Health and Safety Code). Untreated medical waste shall not be disposed of in a solid waste landfill, as defined in Section 40195.1. Medical waste that has been treated and deemed to be solid waste shall be regulated pursuant to this division.
- 3. "Disposed Waste" means Solid Waste that is not Other Waste
- 4. The Facility Fee on Other Waste sunset on December 31, 2012. The Facility Fee still applies to Other Waste (often called "beneficial reuse"), deposited in landfills outside Alameda County prior to December 31, 2012. Other Waste means Solid Waste that conforms to the requirements of one or more of the following: (i) it is deposited in a manner such that it is classified under state law as beneficial reuse that counts for diversion for the purpose of compliance with Public Resource Code 41780 et.seq.; (ii) it is earthen material including contaminated soils as defined in Title 14, California Code of Regulations, Section 17361 (b), and soil with contaminants other than petroleum hydrocarbons that has been approved for use as landfill daily or intermediate cover by the Regional Water Quality Control Board and any other government agencies from which approval is required, such as the Department of Toxic Substances Control or Air Quality Management District; or (iii) it is inert materials as defined in Title 27, California Code of Regulations, Section 20230.
- The Alameda County Facility Fee is \$4.34/ton of Waste Disposed in Landfill.
