StopWaste is the Alameda County Waste Management Authority, the Alameda County Source Reduction and Recycling Board, and the Energy Council operating as one public agency.

Subject: Quarterly Disbursement of Measure D Revenues January – March 2019

The Alameda County Waste Reduction and Recycling Initiative (Measure D), levies a surcharge on solid waste landfilled in unincorporated Alameda County. Fifty percent of Recycling Fund revenues are disbursed to cities and sanitary districts that meet criteria contained in the law. Funds disbursed to municipalities must be used "...for the continuation and expansion of municipal recycling programs." The quarterly Measure D disbursement for your jurisdiction, covering the period January – March, 2019 is enclosed with the copy of this letter sent to your staff Technical Advisory Committee (TAC) representative or designee. Per Board policy, the population numbers are adjusted to CA Dept. of Finance Table E-5 data in even numbered years for disbursements made at the end of August.

Over the past two years, staff has developed and implemented a streamlined reporting system to submit Annual Measure D Financial and Data Reporting forms, which now allows member agency staff to complete the forms on-line via a dedicated web portal. In addition, staff is in the process of finalizing a guidance document to clarify and identify eligible Measure D expenditures.

A review of the Measure D website, submittal of approved staffing hour data, as well as the guidance document regarding eligible Measure D expenses will be provided to member agency staff at the August 1, 2019 TAC meeting. Custom web-portal access information will be sent via email in late August. The Annual Measure D Reporting forms will need to be electronically completed and submitted using the appropriate on-line web portal by October 25, 2019.
