ALTERNATIVES TO BAY AREA INVASIVE PLANTS

Invasive plants used in landscaping often escape into our natural areas, where they can spread rapidly and outcompete natives, degrade wildlife habitat and increase the fuel load.

Invasive plants are by nature a regional problem. The problem plants listed here have escaped from gardens in the Bay Area and invaded natural areas. This list of problem plants and suggested alternatives is from the California Invasive Plant Council (Cal-IPC).
