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Subject: Quarterly Disbursement of Measure D Revenues April - June, 2019

The Alameda County Waste Reduction and Recycling Initiative (Measure D) levies a surcharge on solid waste landfilled in unincorporated Alameda County. Fifty percent of Recycling Fund revenues are disbursed to cities and sanitary districts that meet criteria contained in the law. Funds disbursed to municipalities must be used "...for the continuation and expansion of municipal recycling programs." The quarterly Measure D disbursement for your jurisdiction, covering the period April - June 2019, is enclosed with the copy of this letter sent to your staff Technical Advisory Committee (TAC) representative or designee. Population numbers were updated in August 2019 in accordance to board policy, updated population numbers per city can be found in the attached document titled Chart of Allocations.

Recommendations from Recycling Board Five Year Financial & Compliance Audits included various suggestions aimed at strengthening Board internal controls and clarifying Board policies regarding eligible expenditures of Measure D funds. At the recent August TAC meeting, staff provided an overview of the portal features and documents as well distributed a guidance document to clarify and identify eligible Measure D expenditures.

Annual Measure D Reporting forms will need to be electronically completed and submitted using the online web portal by <u>October 29, 2019</u>. The custom web portal access information will be sent via email in early September.

Please note, Measure D requires StopWaste to contract for an audit to determine compliance with Measure D every five years, which is broken out by finance/compliance and programmatic analysis. The finance /compliance portion is conducted in three and two year segments to make it easier for municipalities to respond to audit data requests. The financial audit component will be conducted starting January 2020 to determine compliance for Fiscal Years 16/17, 17/18 and 18/19. Auditors will utilize the information submitted via the portal. If all required data summited by the municipality is accurate and clear, the auditors may not need to contact staff for additional information.
