**Subject: Quarterly Disbursement of Measure D Revenues Jan. – March, 2012**

The Alameda County Waste Reduction and Recycling Initiative (Measure D), levies a surcharge on solid waste landfilled in unincorporated Alameda County. Fifty percent of Recycling Fund revenues are disbursed to cities and sanitary districts that meet criteria contained in the law. Funds disbursed to municipalities must be used "...for the continuation and expansion of municipal recycling programs."

Enclosed with the copy sent to your staff Technical Advisory Committee (TAC) representative or designee please find the quarterly Measure D disbursement for your jurisdiction, covering the period January - March 2012.

The firm of SAIC Energy, Environment & Infrastructure, LLC has been retained by the Recycling Board to conduct the "5 Year Program Assessment" and countywide recycling program evaluation mandated by the County Charter. The cooperation of your staff in providing information requested by SAIC in order to complete this assessment will be greatly appreciated.
