



# Apartment and Condominium Recycling Guide

Part of being a good neighbor is recycling properly. Success depends on owners, managers and tenants working together to meet local laws.

**Property owners or managers** are required to provide the following for their tenants:

- Provide containers and subscribe to a sufficient service level for all recyclable materials.
- Provide signage on or near containers describing proper separation of recyclables.
- Provide information to tenants annually and no later than 14 days after they move in.

**Residents** are required to sort items properly.

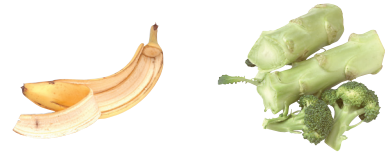

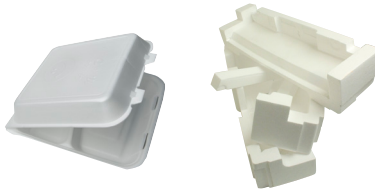
