Subject: Quarterly Disbursement of Measure D Revenues January 2017 – March 2017

The Alameda County Waste Reduction and Recycling Initiative (Measure D) levies a surcharge on solid waste landfilled in unincorporated Alameda County. Fifty percent of Recycling Fund revenues are disbursed to cities and sanitary districts that meet criteria contained in the law. Funds disbursed to municipalities must be used "...for the continuation and expansion of municipal recycling programs." The quarterly Measure D disbursement for your jurisdiction, covering the period January 2017-March 2017, is enclosed with the copy of this letter sent to your staff Technical Advisory Committee (TAC) representative or designee.

I would particularly call your attention to the following:

- 1. Crowe Horwath LLP, the independent auditors contracted to review all revenues and expenditures of Recycling Fund monies and compliance with the terms of the County Charter, have completed their review of member agency data for FY 14/15 and FY 15/16 and should issue their draft report within the next few months. Thank you for your assistance.
2. HF&H Consultants LLC are the independent reviewers recently contracted to evaluate waste reduction efforts throughout the county and identify best practices for program performance and metrics going forward, per the requirements of the County Charter. HF&H are wrapping up data requests and feedback on metrics to help measure progress of programs.

The continued cooperation of member agency staff in helping these contractors complete their reviews in a timely manner is greatly appreciated.
