StopWaste is the Alameda County Waste Management Authority, the Alameda County Source Reduction and Recycling Board, and the Energy Council operating as one public agency.

Subject: Quarterly Disbursement of Measure D Revenues July – September 2019

The quarterly Measure D disbursement for your jurisdiction, covering the period April - June 2019, is enclosed with an electronic copy of this letter sent to your staff Technical Advisory Committee (TAC) representative or designee. The Alameda County Waste Reduction and Recycling Initiative (Measure D) levies a surcharge on solid waste landfilled in unincorporated Alameda County. Fifty percent of Recycling Fund revenues are disbursed to cities and sanitary districts that meet criteria contained in the law. Fund amounts disbursed to municipalities are based on population, and must be used "...for the continuation and expansion of municipal recycling programs." Population numbers per city (updated in August 2019) can be found in the attached document titled Chart of Allocations.

The submittal deadline for the annual Measure D Reporting forms (using the online web portal) was extended from October 29, 2019 to November 8, 2019 as a result of issues with PG&E, air quality and computer servers. Agency staff is in the process of reviewing submittal data and may be contacting municipal staff for additional information if needed.
