Subject: Quarterly Disbursement of Measure D Revenues July – September 2017

The Alameda County Waste Reduction and Recycling Initiative (Measure D), levies a surcharge on solid waste landfilled in unincorporated Alameda County. Fifty percent of Recycling Fund revenues are disbursed to cities and sanitary districts that meet criteria contained in the law. Funds disbursed to municipalities must be used "...for the continuation and expansion of municipal recycling programs." The quarterly Measure D disbursement for your jurisdiction, covering the period July - September 2017, is enclosed with the copy of this letter sent to your staff Technical Advisory Committee (TAC) representative or designee. Per Board policy, the population numbers are adjusted to CA Dept. of Finance Table E-5 data in even numbered years for disbursements made at the end of August.

As a follow up to various recommendations from the Phase One Five Year Financial & Compliance Audit, StopWaste staff updated and streamlined the Annual Measure D Financial and Data Reporting forms to allow member agency staff to complete the forms on-line via a dedicated web portal. At the September 7, 2017 TAC meeting, StopWaste staff provided TAC members with an overview of the new system, including step by step instructions for form completion with ample time for questions and answers to ensure member agency staff understand the new system reporting features. Member agency staff successfully completed FY 16-17 Annual Measure D Financial and Data Reporting forms using the web portal. Moving forward, all Annual Measure D Financial and Data Reporting will be completed utilizing this web portal, which will store all submitted data allowing auditors to access Measure D data electronically for future Five Year Audits.
