Subject: Quarterly Disbursement of Measure D Revenues July – Sept., 2016

The Alameda County Waste Reduction and Recycling Initiative (Measure D) levies a surcharge on solid waste landfilled in unincorporated Alameda County. Fifty percent of Recycling Fund revenues are disbursed to cities and sanitary districts that meet criteria contained in the law. Funds disbursed to municipalities must be used "...for the continuation and expansion of municipal recycling programs." The quarterly Measure D disbursement for your jurisdiction, covering the period July - September 2016, is enclosed with the copy of this letter sent to your staff Technical Advisory Committee (TAC) representative or designee.

Crowe Horwath LLP, the independent auditors contracted to review all revenues and expenditures of Recycling Fund monies and compliance with the terms of the County Charter, are beginning their review of FY 14/15 and FY 15/16. They will be contacting the staff person listed on your most recent Measure D Annual Report submittal to arrange a time to review your records.
2. HF&H Consultants LLC are the independent reviewers recently contracted to evaluate waste reduction efforts throughout the county and identify best practices for program performance and metrics going forward, per the requirements of the County Charter.

The cooperation of member agency staff in helping these contractors complete their reviews in a timely manner is appreciated.
