The RE:Source guide is the latest generation of online search tools from StopWaste.org, intended to provide answers for what to do with the things you no longer need. It replaces the previous online guide RecycleWhere.org, and is faster and easier to use, and more importantly, provides reuse & repair alternatives and comprehensive curbside service information.

This document is intended to provide guidelines and sample language that can be used when promoting the RE:Source guide. It is accompanied by a downloadable messaging kit which contains a variety of images that can be used to help promote RE:Source.


The messaging kit also includes example buttons and badges that can be used to direct visitors to the RE:Source guide:
