The updated California Model Water Efficient Landscape Ordinance (WELO) has been in effect throughout the state for over three years.

The new WELO:

- Affects all new permitted landscape construction over 500 square feet
- Is required by CALGreen
- Significantly reduces applied water allowances
- Requires compost on all projects
