

Countywide Integrated Waste Management Plan - 2020 Update

California state law requires that each county adopt a County Integrated Waste Management Plan (CoIWMP) that serves as a roadmap to approaching countywide solid waste and recycling issues, including landfill needs.

The Alameda County Waste Management Authority is in the process of updating the Countywide Element of the CoIWMP, a key component of the Plan that includes goals, objectives, and policies to guide decision making and desired outcomes for the Agency's work.

The Countywide Element provides a broad overview of the desired state of waste and materials management in Alameda County. Like a general plan for cities, this document is intended to be far-reaching with long-term relevance. It is a complement to StopWaste's annual budget, which provides the programmatic specificity to implement the Countywide Element on a practical level each year.

The draft Countywide Element goals include:



Disposal Capacity

Manage discards and minimize landfill impacts consistent with waste reduction objectives.



Public Engagement

Inform and engage the public in waste reduction activities.



Responsible Infrastructure

Maximize environmental benefits for recycling and composting by balancing high volume of recovery with related considerations: quality of commodities, operating impacts of facilities, and other environmental impacts of programs.



Regional Collaboration

Address regional, state, and federal issues, and develop programs in partnership with member agencies, the private sector, and other key stakeholders.



Materials Management

Shift from managing discards to reducing consumption, managing materials at their highest and best use, and addressing environmental impacts across the full life cycle of materials and products.



Funding

Manage revenues and expenditures to implement countywide priority programs and facilities to achieve the goals outlined in the CoIWMP.
